Concerned Citizens for Justice Rejects DA Ramsey's Findings In Police Shooting Death of Stephen Vest

Concerned Citizens for Justice will hold a Press Conference and Rally addressing the fatal officer-involved shooting of Stephen Vest by Chico police. In his report on the killing, released on January 14, Butte County District Attorney Mike Ramsey determined that "the shooting by the involved officers [was] justified.

CC4J rejects these findings. We believe that if the police had followed de-escalation techniques and humane policing, Stephen Vest would be alive today.

On October 14, 2020, at 7:59 pm, Chico police officers shot Vest to death 50 seconds after they arrived at the scene in the Petco parking lot at East 20th Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway. Vest was 30 years old. After reading Ramsey's report and viewing video footage, CC4J finds that the police officers failed to practice de-escalation, and made no attempt to defuse the situation.

Stephen Vest's death is the third shooting death of young men experiencing mental health crises at the hands of Chico Police in 3 ½ years. CC4J is convinced that these deaths could have been prevented by implementing CC4J's Action Plan, which mandates tried and true skills in deescalation and involvement of mental health professionals, in addition to being armed with non-lethal weapons such as bean bag shotguns. A transformation of police culture is essential. The value of all lives must be our first priority.

CC4J wants an independent investigation and intends to file a formal complaint with the state Attorney General's office about conflict of interest and the unnecessary use of lethal force in the police shooting death of Stephen Vest.

All in attendance are expected to observe social distancing and wear masks.
